

## WHAT WE HOPE TO BUILD

We know that one week of activity against the induction centers-- even if we close them down across the country-- will not stop the draft. We see this week as a way of involving young people who are facing conscription: black people, high school students, the unemployed and young working people. They are the political base on which a movement can be built that will take a way from the government the support and the bodies that it needs to carry on its military adventures around the world.

We hope that by using obstructive tactics against the draft process that we will demonstrate to thousands of young people that the draft can be stopped, that this will spur further anti-draft activity and will build a movement that will lead to the immediate withdrawal of American troops from Vietnam.

Our high schools, both in the black and white communities, have become recruiting centers for the Army. We must stop this government indoctrination.

## NON-DRAFT-ELIGIBLE SUPPORT

Other people who are not faced with induction will join and support our efforts. Many have declared that they wish to take the same risks and suffer the same penalties as those facing induction. Our week-long action gives them and the many anti-war groups the opportunity to give full support in action. We call on them to participate in the National STOP THE DRAFT Week.

We are not a coalition of organizations, but a group of organizers. Our activities in the Bay Area will focus on the Oakland Induction Center. We are now planning a schedule of events for the Week.
