86% of the house voting:

- I. We, the residents of Alondra House, Florence Moore, support the goals of the April Third Movement:
  - A. Closer control by the University of SRI, including immediate cessation and future non-acceptance of research at both Stanford and SRI in the areas of chemical-biological warfare, and counterinsurgency.
  - B. Cessation and future non-acceptance of other research in support of the wars in Southeast Asia.
  - C. Cessation and future non-acceptance of classified research.
  - D. An open decision-making meeting later this month on control of SRI.

The following is a resolution passed by the residents of Arroyo house in Wilbur Hall. It is addressed to the trustees with copies sent to President Pitzer, the AEL Community, KZSU, and the Stanford Daily.

RESOLVED:

We, the residents of Arroyo house, Wilbur Hall, support the following:

- 1) We wholeheartedly support the goals and demands of the April 3 coalition. Stanford's and Stanford Research Institute's involvement in chemical and biological warfare, counter-insurgency, and war related research must be ended by immediate action of the Board of Trustees.
- 2) We endorse the tactics of the AEL sit-in, insofar as its non-violent nature is maintained, and that all democratic procedures continue to be implemented in the decision-making process.
- 3) We contribute \$50.00 from house funds to the payment of bills incurred in the use of AEL printing facilities.
- 4) We urge that no disciplinary or legal action be taken against those sitting-in at the AEL for their non-violent actions there.

With 92% of the house voting, the above statements were endorsed by the following majorities:
