We the undersigned ~~employees~~ of Stanford University wish to affirm our support of the sit-in at the Applied Electronics Laboratory. We feel, as do the students who are sitting in,

(1) that there must be a permanent moratorium on research of the following types:

- Chemical and Biological Warfare research,
- Counter-insurgency research at home and abroad,
- applied military research in Laos, Thailand and Vietnam,
- all classified research;

(2) that the Stanford Research Institute not be severed from the University, but rather that it be brought under closer control of the University Community;

(3) that the Trustees hold an open decision making meeting on campus to determine their response to the above demands.

We further wish to affirm our belief that there should be no disciplinary action taken against those students, faculty and staff who through the Trustees' intransigence have found it necessary to resort to the occupation of the AEL.
