2. That the Stanford Research Institute not be severed from the University, but rather that it be brought under closer control by Stanford.
3. That we approve the tactics of the April Third Coalition, insofar as they are non-violent and non-destructive.
4. That no punitive action be taken against the students occupying Applied Electronics Laboratory.

Further, we urge the members of the English Department faculty to use their influence, both individually and collectively, in achieving these goals.

(1) that there must be a permanent moratorium on research of the following types:

- Chemical and Biological Warfare research,

- applied military research in Laos, Thailand and Vietnam,
- all classified research;
