

GENERAL MEETING OF STUDENT BODY

CALLED FOR TOMORROW, FRIDAY, 1:00, IN FROST AMPHITHEATER

President Denis Hayes, under the provision of the ASSU Constitution which grants him the power to call meetings of the Association (Art. II, Sec. 2, f), has called a meeting for tomorrow afternoon to discuss the entire student body's position in regard to matters affecting the University.

I. The meeting will discuss the issues included in a questionnaire being mailed to all faculty and students to poll their opinion on:

1. The types of research which should or should not be conducted by S.R.I. (chemical warfare, biological warfare, radiological warfare, counter-insurgency, Department of Defense, classified).
2. The relationship of S.R.I. and the University.
Should the present relationship continue?
Should S.R.I. be more strongly controlled by the University?
Should S.R.I. be sold?
If S.R.I. is sold, what if any should be the restrictions on that sale?

Pro and Con positions on the S.R.I. issues followed by open debate will take place. (For further background information students are asked to consult the majority and minority reports of the S.R.I. Committee which appeared in the Tuesday, April 15, Stanford Daily).

II. The meeting will discuss and vote upon the following resolutions:

1. We commend the April 3 Coalition for helping to focus the attention of the campus upon the nature of research being conducted at Stanford and S.R.I.
2. We wish to join the S.R.I. Coalition in urging a cessation of the following types of research:
 - a. Chemical, biological, and radiological warfare research
 - b. Counter-insurgency research
 - c. Research related to the War in S.E. Asia
 - d. Classified research
3. We believe that to either continue the present demonstration at A.E.L. or to escalate that demonstration would be counterproductive to the goals of the Coalition. We urge the students in the Applied Electronics Laboratory to discontinue their sit-in.
4. We will join with the April 3 Coalition to establish a Center Against Immoral Research in the Old Union Courtyard as a base from which to educate the Stanford community.
5. We call upon the students and faculty of Stanford to hold a one-day cessation of classes on Wednesday, April 23. This Day of Concern will be devoted to a series of speeches, rallies, and seminars examining the implications of various kinds of research and their appropriateness to a university.
6. We consider it to be in the best interests of the University for the Board of Trustees to 1) decide to discontinue the above types of research, and 2) make a decision regarding the future relationship of Stanford and S.R.I. no later than its May 13 meeting.
