28 Upon reading the verified complaint and the supporting
29 declarations in this action, and it appearing to the satisfaction
30 of the Court from said complaint and declarations that this is a

1 proper case for the issuance of a temporary restraining order,
2 and that, unless the temporary restraining order prayed for in
3 said complaint be granted, great and irreparable injury will
4 result to plaintiff before the matter can be heard on notice;

5 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pending the
6 hearing and determination on the hereinafter mentioned order to
7 show cause, the above-named defendants, and each of them and
8 all persons having notice of this order, and each of them, are
9 hereby enjoined and restrained from doing or causing to be done,
10 directly or indirectly, any of the following acts or things:

11 1. Entering any academic administrative or service
12 building on the principal academic campus of Stanford University
13 or any classroom, laboratory, auditorium, library or office
14 therein for the purpose and with the effect of disrupting
15 classes, meetings, research activities or the conduct of the
16 business of Stanford University.

17 2. Obstructing the free use of any academic, admin-
18 istrative or service building on the principal academic campus
19 of Stanford University, or the free use of any classroom,
20 laboratory, auditorium, library or office therein or the door-
21 ways, halls, covered walks or porticoes, basements or roofs
22 thereof.

23 3. Obstructing the legitimate movement of any person
24 about the Stanford University campus or in any Stanford Univer-
25 sity building or facility.

26 4. *in the connection with any of the foregoing conduct*
27 Occupying the Applied Electronics Laboratory,
28 Encina Hall or any other academic, administrative or service
29 building on the principal academic campus of Stanford University.

30 5. In the case of those defendants who have been
suspended as students of Stanford University from entering

1 the principal campus of Stanford University during the period of
2 their suspension other than to attend meetings of the Judicial
3 Council of the University.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above-named defendants,
and each of them, appear before this Court in the Courtroom of
Department No. 2 at the North County Building, 270 Grant
Street, Palo Alto, California, on May 13, 1969, at
the hour of 9:30 A.M., then and there to show cause, if any
they have, why they, and each of them, and all persons acting in
concert with them, and all persons having notice of the order,
should not be enjoined and restrained from engaging in, committing
or performing, directly or indirectly, any and all of the follow-
ing acts or things:

1. Entering any academic administrative or service
building on the principal academic campus of Stanford University
or any classroom, laboratory, auditorium, library or office
therein for the purpose and with the effect of disrupting
classes, meetings, research activities or the conduct of the
business of Stanford University.

2. Obstructing the free use of any academic, admin-
istrative or service building on the principal academic campus
of Stanford University, or the free use of any classroom,
laboratory, auditorium, library or office therein or the door-
ways, halls, covered walks or porticoes, basements or roofs
thereof.

1 3. Obstructing the legitimate movement of any person
2 about the Stanford University campus or in any Stanford Univer-
3 sity building or facility.

4 4. Occupying *in the connection with any of the foregoing conduct*
5 Encina Hall or any other academic, administrative or service
6 building on the principal academic campus of Stanford University.

7 5. In the case of those defendants who have been
8 suspended as students of Stanford University from entering the
9 principal campus of Stanford University during the period of
10 their suspension other than to attend meetings of the Judicial
11 Council of the University.

12 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that copies of said complaint,
13 declarations, memorandum of points and authorities, and this
14 order to show cause and temporary restraining order be served
15 on said defendants not later than May 9, 1969.
