

The Stanford Community Research Review Board

1. Caucuses from each of the following disciplines will be established: law, physical sciences, social sciences, humanities, engineering, life sciences, mathematical sciences, and computer sciences. Every caucus member must accept the Guidelines for Research at Stanford and SRI adopted by this community. Caucus members must be willing to work on the review of contract proposals. These are the only qualifications for caucus membership.
2. Each caucus will elect one "student and one "faculty member to participate on a Review Board Council. ("Student" and "faculty member" are to be understood broadly to include staff and other closely associated with the university community.)
3. A caucus of SRI employees, constituted as they wish, will elect one representative for each of the above disciplines to participate on a Review Board Council.
4. Caucuses of each of the following community groups will elect one representative to participate on a Review Board Council:
 - a. blacks, Mexican-Americans and other Third World groups
 - b. high school students
 - c. concerned Peninsula residents and workers
 - d. students from the Third World
5. Caucus members will serve as researchers and advisors on contracts. They will thus guide their elected representatives.
6. The Review Board Council will be constituted when a minimum of 8 members are elected. It will establish its own operating procedures. For example, it might choose to form itself into subcommittees to consider research areas such as CBW, counterinsurgency and so forth. It will meet with the Guidelines and Review Board Committee to prepare a final version of the Guidelines for approval by the April 3rd coalition.
7. The Review Board Council will be responsible for reporting to the community those contracts which it finds unacceptable. It must hold open hearings.
8. If the Review Board Council does not act upon a new contract or research proposal within 30 days, the contract or proposal is automatically approved.

IMPLEMENTATION

In order to implement the demands of the April 3rd coalition, the Review Board will need the following information:

1. Summaries of contracts at SRI whose existence is classified.
2. Summaries of all other contracts at SRI and Stanford.
3. All new research proposals at SRI and Stanford.
