How SDS Plotted Stanford Violence

The violent disruption of the Stanford University trustees meeting on Jan. 14, for which 29 students received suspensions and fines last week, was no spontaneous demonstration. The Examiner learned today.

The scuffle-punctuated invasion was planned nearly two weeks in advance by campus members of the Students for a Democratic Society, a revolutionary-anarchist organization associated with most major campus disorders prevalent today.

SDS leaders not only planned the confrontation which made a shambles of the trustees meeting, but have laid the groundwork for an all-out effort "to destroy the corporate-imperialist university."

These facts came to light with the disclosure of SDS "plans and strategy" as contained in two confidential memos intended solely for top echelon members.

Leaked from within the SDS, the memos contain these highlights:

- "We are building a socialist revolutionary movement and support revolutionary movements throughout the Third World, including the NLF (National Liberation Front of the Viet Cong)."
- "We are . . . supporting the NLF — as a constructive alternative to U.S. imperialism."
- "It is important to get

non-SDS people committed to confrontation as the basic means of achieving radical goals."

- "We must radicalize as many students as we can and make socialist revolutionaries out of as many student radicals as is possible."
- "We are going to need quite a few radical revolutionaries to destroy the corporate-imperialist university."
- "It is conceivable that we can liberate parts of it (the university); burrow from within the departments or start one up, like a Department of Radical Studies."

- "Our presentation (to the trustees) should disrupt the normal deliberations of the board. Following the presentation (ultimatum) and disruption, we should hold a meeting outside the trustees meetings to keep immediate pressure on the trustees . . ."

Film Use

The memos also contained plans for organizing in the various dormitories on campus and the use of films, including a revolutionary-slanted film of the Columbia University riots.

Men within the SDS are urged to "begin thinking about organizing in the Army instead of non-cooperation if they get drafted."

"If we are serious about risking death together, we'd damn well better start living together," one memo reads in advocating the leasing of eight or ten houses for the "formation of many groups small enough so that

The SDS leaders, who recently hoisted the red flag of revolution and the black flag of anarchy over the campus, also called for an attack on "the power of the faculty at the department level," urged recruitment of radical faculty, and observed:

"The New University Conference might be forming a chapter here, and this might be the catalyst needed to get a radical faculty group going."

Livermore Chooses New Schools Head

LIVERMORE — Board members of the Livermore Valley Unified School District today named Edwin Lundstrom as acting superintendent. Lundstrom has been associate superintendent.

He succeeds Dr. Peter Bancroft, whose resignation from the \$27,000 a year position is effective June 30. The board, however, has appointed him as its administrative advisor at the same salary under his contract, which has three years to run.
