SUSPECT: Siegel, Leonard, a WMA, Stanford student, believed to live at 2357 Oakwood, E. Palo Alto, 325-7604. AT LARGE.

STATEMENTS: Witness LITTLEBOY states that he is employed by the Stanford News Service, Stanford University, and has been with them for approximately 12 years. He states that on at least six separate occasions prior to 11:00 a.m. on the 16th of May, 1969, he noted subject Leonard Siegel in the crowd of dissidents that were on or near the Stanford Research Institute building at 2690 Hanover. He noted Siegel was dressed in dark pants and a brownish color 3/4 length raincoat. At about 1100 that date, Mr. Littleboy was in front of the SRI building facing Hanover Street. It was at that time that the dissidents were throwing rocks and other objects through the glass windows of the SRI building. Shortly after this attack on the building, Mr. Littleboy states that he saw Leonard Siegel heading south on Hanover towards Page Mill Road. This was about 11:00 a.m. He saw Siegel approach a yellow canister which had been thrown by the police officers in an effort to disperse the crowd, bend over, pick up the canister and throw it through the second story window of the SRI building. Mr. Littleboy states that he is positive the subject was Leonard Siegel and he is willing to testify and sign complaints if necessary.

REPORT: AT about 0830, 16 May 69, I first saw subject, Leonard Siegel, in the Standard Station Parking Lot, at the corner of Page Mill and Hanover. At that time he was wearing a 3/4 length dark brown raincoat, dark pants, sunglasses with black rims and dark gloves. About a half-hour later I saw him in front of the SRI building at 2690 Hanover talking to four black militant type subjects. At about 1050 I noticed Siegl in the group of dissident students at the barricade that was across Hanover in front of the SRI building. At that time Siegel was wearing a white face mask and still had on his brown raincoat, glasses and gloves. At that time, Assistant Chief Anderson admonished the students to disperse. The dissidents did disperse, however, about 15 minutes later, I saw a group that appeared to be the same dissidents walking south on Hanover and were blocking all the lanes in the streets. They numbered over 100 at that time. At this point, I noted subject Leonard Siegel was right in the middle at the front line of the students. However, at this time, he was without his jacket and was wearing a light colored shirt, but still wearing his black gloves and white face mask. The unit from Tac Squad confronted the students and they retreated very slowly. All of the aforementioned incidents in my report can be verified by many of the photographs taken at the scene on the 16th of May.



I also saw him about a week or two ago at the North County Courthouse. He was with a Negro student named Johnson who was there for a probation report and hearing. The photos and photographers as well as witnesses will be available for trial when needed.

Complaint and warrant pending. The charges on the complaint will be Section 404, Riot, 416, Failure to Disperse and 594, Malicious Mischief, which covers Siegel throwing the tear gas cannister through the SKI window.
