

WORK STOPPAGE CONTINUES

National Work Stoppage has changed its name to STOP for Peace. The committee has joined with a Los Angeles group to canvass all California labor organizations on the prospect of a Work Stoppage on June 30. This entails contacting over 2000 local unions, as well as professional societies, church groups, and schools.

A subcommittee called BLAM (Blitz Action for McGovern-Hatfield) has been formed under the aegis of Richard Almond. This group is using the previously established communication network to organize pressure campaigns in the states of key congressmen.

These short-term goals are the forerunners of a long-term effort to change the political consciousness of the country. A group called LONG is pursuing the creation of a permanent laborstudent coalition.
