14 Having heard the testimony of the plaintiff to the effect that:

15 Stanford University has leased its vast lands with primary regard for profit
16 and considerable disregard for the needs of the People in the area;

17 and that it has encouraged on its lands the development of an infamous
18 military-industrial-complex which has inflicted, through its normal
19 operations, untold suffering on the world's Peoples;

20 and further, that it has consistently failed to make its lands available for
21 housing for low-income persons who most need it, thus driving up rents and
22 forcing both workers and students to pay through the nose and drive great
23 distances;

24 and finally, that it has added greatly to the destruction of the environment
25 through its failure to consider the over-all effects of its industrial and
26 commercial development on the land, air and water,

28 THE PEOPLE'S COURT THEREFORE ISSUES AN ORDER TO GRANT A PRELIMINARY
29 INJUNCTION AGAINST THE Defendants, ENJOINING THEM FROM ANY AND ALL OF THE
30 FOLLOWING ACTS:

31 The continued leasing of Stanford's vast lands without collective decisions
32 about the use of those lands;

33 The surveying and construction of the project known commonly as Palo Alto
34 Square;

35 The further leasing and development of the area known commonly as Coyote
36 Hill;

37 And the continued with-holding of the large tracts of land suitable for low-
38 income housing from those persons who most need it.
