Malicious mischief and damage at the Main Library was reported to Stanford police Tuesday night, March 16. Ink and glue were poured over books and other damage was inflicted to the extent of at least \$100, librarians reported to the police.

At 8:06 p.m. a false fire alarm was turned in from a box in the Main Library basement. Firemen found a note attached to the box: "Reinstate John Keilch."

Shortly after 10 p.m. a freshly painted sign was found sprayed on the pavement near Dinkelspiel Auditorium: "Workers Fight Back."

Keilch, a former Stanford student and a technical processing assistant in the Main Library, was suspended for 45 days effective Monday, March 15, for participating in the disruption of Henry Cabot Lodge's speech at Stanford Jan. 11.
