Sirs,

Last spring the student body, in an official election, voted 1758 to 1569 in favor of amending our policy on corporate recruiting to "prohibit the use of Stanford lands by corporations that are directly producing material and research for the military." The recruitment interviews that have been scheduled for your representatives at the Student Placement Center during the week of Nov. 1 are in violation of this official expression of student opinion.

We ask that you respect this referendum and refrain from sending your representatives to conduct the business of recruiting at the Placement Center next week.

We do not wish to ban your representatives from the campus. On the contrary, we invite them to come at any time to discuss with the student body the policies and contracts of your corporation. But we see no way that your corporation, as a major military contractor, can conduct the business of recruiting on this campus without violating this student referendum.
